


DEEP'S PERMIT ASSISTANCE

- Pre-application Meeting






- Permit Assistance has been offered for many years in CT
- Concierge services are an emerging amenity in many states
- Some impactful areas to improve user experience:
 - Easily digestible information for quick understanding and reference
 - Organization of available resources
 (videos, flow charts, tables, handbooks, factsheets)

Online Permit Status & Document Viewer – New York's Status and Document Viewer

Automated conveyance of information used to balance staff resources

- Falls under New York's "Uniform Procedure Act", which:
 - Ensures transparency & timely review of permits
 - > The result: DART Portal
- Login with an application ID
- Disclaimers that not every document can be released
- Portal lists contact information for questions, and links to a public notice bulletin

• CT has some online permit status portal tools:

- EZ-file can view status, limited number of permits
- Online Document viewer can view documents if uploaded, not all are yet
- Having a permit status viewer for internal and external inquiries would be helpful

For some of our permits, submit applications and other forms to the DNR online. Get a WAMS ID, complete an application, sign and pay fees in a few steps. Track permits and know exactly where they are in the permitting process.

REGISTER for a \

BEGIN

a new or edit an existing application, sign and pay fees online.*

VIEW




- Increasing the amount of permits able to be submitted online may help balance staff resources
- Having a payment portal for telework in future may be helpful
 - States with E-Licensing and/or Permit
 Status Portals ME, NH, WI, NY, FL, RI

Automated Permit Questionnaire - Washington State's Project Questionnaire

- Determine which local, state, and federal permits you might need for your project
- Plan ahead for required permits
- Identify agency contacts for each permit
- Learn detailed information about individual permit requirements



Automated Permit Questionnaire - Washington State's Project Questionnaire cont'd



- Lists out all permits necessary at the end
- Produces a printable, savable PDF report
- Provides links to all necessary information



AUTOMATED
PERMIT
QUESTIONNAIRE

- Automated permit questionnaire (VT, WA, WI, NH)
- Automated questionnaire could be helpful
- Not intended to replace in-person meetings when requested, simply to provide all info possible upfront and assist in project planning
- CT has written pre-application questionnaire:
 - How can we improve ours?
 - > Add more questions, be more comprehensive with respect to programs?
 - How can we use this to better balance staff resources?
 - Can we use a scheduling software, like restaurant reservations, to schedule pre-apps?



STORMWATER PERMITS FOR **NEW DEVELOPMENT & REDEVELOPMENT**

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT

General Permit 3-9015

General Permit 3-9015 was issued March 20, 2013 and is effective for ten years from the date of signing.

The Stormwater Management Program provides regulatory oversight and technical assistance to ensure proper design and construction of stormwater treatment and control practices as well as construction-related erosion prevention and sediment control practices, necessary to minimize the adverse impacts of stormwater runoff to surface waters throughout Vermont.

Coverage under GP 3-9015 is required for discharges of regulated stormwater runoff from the construction, expansion, and redevelopment of impervious surfaces.

EXAMPLE OF REGULATED **ACTIVITY**

Stormwater runoff from new development which creates 1 or more acres of impervious surfaces, or expansions to existing development when the total resulting surface, including existing and new expanded surfaces is equal to or greater than 1 ages. Importing surfaces include roofs, drivouslys, parking
