## What is a pesticide?

Any substance or mixture of substances intended for preventing, destroying, repelling, or mitigating any pest.

## What kinds of pests can be controlled?

There are all kinds of pests that fall under the pesticide program such as: insects, weeds, and bacteria just to name a few. Pesticides can also be used to control other issues such as lawn diseases and invasive species.

## Want to know what pesticides are being sprayed at properties abutting yours?

You can sign up to be on the abutters list. Check on our website for how to submit your information annually to be on this. Then a company who is going to be applying pesticides to properties directly abutting yours will notify you at least 24 hours ahead of time.

## Who needs to be certified?

Anyone who applies pesticides, general or restricted use (including organic pesticides), in a commercial capacity, a person who wants to use restricted use products on their property or their employers property or to produce agricultural commodities, and anyone practicing aboriculture even without the use of pesticides.

## How to look up a license?

Go to [elicense.ct.gov](http://elicense.ct.gov) and click online services, and then generate roster(s). Here you can select the information you want to search for. You can search for information such as certified supervisors, or restricted use pesticides.
