Recycling has been mandatory in Connecticut since 1991, and for years many Connecticut cities and towns have been operating successful and innovative recycling programs. The efforts of these towns have resulted in innumerable environmental benefits both locally and globally. However, in spite of these impressive achievements, the towns were not receiving formal recognition for their ongoing efforts. Therefore, starting in 2002 as part of the celebration of America Recycles Day (ARD), the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection recycling office has selected CT towns and cities to be formally recognized for their outstanding recycling/source reduction programs. The 15 CT cities and towns thus far recognized make up Connecticut's current <u>Municipal Recycling Honor Roll (MRHR)</u>.

However, the MRHR is not just a static list, and once again, as part of ARD - which has been expanded to promote recycling throughout the year and not just on November 15<sup>th</sup> - the state wants to honor those additional CT municipalities with outstanding recycling programs and add their names to the MRHR, but that is easier said than done. There are 169 CT municipalities - and although the Department hears about some of the excellent recycling programs, we don't get the opportunity to see or hear about all the exceptional municipal programs in the state. Therefore, in order not to overlook any towns, we are asking that (1) if you feel that your town has an outstanding recycling program or (2) you know of a another Connecticut municipality with a first-rate municipal recycling programs. Nomination Form" (for either your town or another CT town) and submit it to the DEP Recycling Office. We will be accepting applications throughout the year. If you would like to provide a more detailed description of the nominated program, please do not hesitate to attach additional pages. This year, for the first time, we will allow other entities, such as solid waste haulers and solid waste recycling facilities to nominate towns they think are doing a great job; however the nomination form will still need to be completed and signed by the town.

Winning towns will be chosen based on the information provided in the (1) the "Connecticut's Best Municipal Recycling Programs Nomination Form", (2) the town's annual municipal recycling reports, and (3) visits to the towns by DEP Recycling staff. Not only will such towns be recognized, but they will serve as models - so other CT cities and towns can replicate their recycling successes.

We look forward to sharing your recycling successes with all of Connecticut (and beyond)- so get those nomination forms in and: KEEP ON REDUCING, REUSING, and RECYCLING.
