SUBSTANTIVE CONVERSATION: TIERS CHECKLIST

•Substantive Conversations (30 minutes)

- DEEP to reserve ½ hour of each meeting to brief the Working Group on an issue, a regulatory challenge, a new approach, or regulatory language
 - 10 minutes of briefing and 15 minutes of discussion
 - Receive written feedback until next Working Group meeting

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
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FIRST YEAR ROADMAP

Tiering is AFTER first year!

If you have submitted a Release Closure Report that documents compliance, you would not need to Tier.



SUBCOMMITTEE 5 CHARGE

•After a release has been characterized, if Immediate Action has not fully remediated a release, such release will be placed into a tier. Placement into a tier should include:

- Who will supervise a clean-up (i.e., trained employee, spill contractor, LEP, or the Commissioner)
- Risks to public health and the environment
- Impact to groundwater and other natural resources
- Degree of removal of pollution
- Form of demonstration that remediation is complete
- Timeframe to complete clean-up

•The subcommittee shall evaluate what factors should be used to determine into which tier a release should be placed and whether there are different factors due to the timing of the release.

SUBCOMMITTEE 5 CONCEPT PAPER TIER TAKE AWAYS

- •Tier assignment after one year for releases requiring longer to achieve cleanup standards. Tier classification is the responsibility of the LEP.
- •Characterization of the release to occur within first year.
- •Tiers Identified:
 - 1A DEEP lead, highest risk releases with open exposure pathways
 - 1B LEP lead, highest risk, emerging contaminants
 - 2 Default Tier, LEP lead, requiring remediation
 - 3 Release is stable, closure not yet possible due to MNA, EURs pending

SUBCOMMITTEE 5 CONCEPT PAPER TIER TAKE AWAYS

•Each release should be assigned a tier.

- One property may have more than one release, with each release being in a different tier.
- For co-mingled releases the highest-risk release will dictate the tier.

•Reclassification - Release can be moved to higher risk or lower risk tier after initial classification, based on exposure pathway, level of cleanup, discovery of new receptors, etc.

•Documentation – Tiering/re-tiering form, status report, RAP, public notice, Exit Form (verification).

OTHER SUBCOMMITTEE CONNECTIONS

Subcommittee 3 – Characterization

• Risk from a release may need to be re-evaluated at multiple points (need to revisit tiers)

Subcommittee 4 – Immediate Removal Actions

- Complete IRA within 365 days to avoid placement in tier
- Tier classification should be based on most recent conditions prior to tiering
- Tier placement should consider:
 - Who will supervisor cleanup Commissioner, LEP, other
 - Impact to groundwater
 - Degree of removal of pollution

PURPOSE OF THE TIERS CHECKLIST

- Checklist is a decision tree for evaluating work that has been done within the first year and for subsequent tiering reevaluations.
- Tiering should be a rapid process.
- Tiering is objective, clear cut, Yes or No.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE TIERS CHECKLIST

- Tiers Checklist will be a "form prescribed by Commissioner."
- LEPs must determine and verify the Tier.
- Appropriate, supporting documentation should accompany the checklist.


THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE TIERS CHECKLIST

• One checklist per release.

- Release Definition 22a-134pp. (6) "Release" means any spilling, leaking, pumping, pouring, emitting, emptying, discharging, injecting, escaping, leaching, dumping or disposing into or onto the land and waters of the state, not authorized under this title, of oil or petroleum or chemical liquids or solids, liquid or gaseous products or hazardous waste as defined in section 22a-448. "Release" does not include automotive exhaust or the application of fertilizer or pesticides consistent with their labeling.
- Can submit multiple checklists for multiple releases together under one Location ID.
- One source = one release. Combined remedy for co-mingled releases in soil or groundwater in one location → most stringent Tier would prevail.
- DEEP Oversight means LEP work is overseen by DEEP, as is the case now.


