Waste Not, Want Not!




TRASH FOOTPRINT – According to EPA in 2010, 40 million tons of food waste generated in the U.S. (219 lbs/yr/person) & only 5% (about 1 million tons) recycled!

CT DEEP estimated that in 2015 the average CT resident generates about 4 pounds of trash daily, that's 1370 pounds annually, for a total of more than 2.4 million tons of trash each year! And that's with about a 35% recycling rate!




State of CT 2015 Solid Waste Composition

Waste Reduction

- 1. Source Reduction designing products to reduce amount of waste produced
- 2. Recycling recovery of useful materials
- 3. Composting organic wastes turned into useful soil amendment



- \$100 fee –speakers' travel






