Municipal Transfer Station General Permit

- The General permit was originally issued in November 2007
- Issued for a 5 year term
- Maximum receipt capacity 120 TPD
- Allowed for the receipt of numerous waste types and set associated storage capacities
- Established maximum storage volume for each material/waste type
- No explicit provisions for modification of the TS included in the first MTS GP
- Few municipalities took advantage of the convenience

MTS GP 2012 Changes

- General permit re-issued 2012 with significant modifications
- Increase in the overall receipt capacity and modified storage capacities
 - Receipt of up to 1,000 tons per day of all materials/wastes except for clean wood, leaves and grass clippings
- Provides a streamlined process for implementing physical modifications to the facility
- Expands the list of acceptable/authorized wastes for receipt
- 10 year term with revolving registrations
- Allows for Regional TSs
- Allows quasi-governmental TS owner/operators who serve municipalities to register

MTS GP Provisions

- Provides opportunity for seeking variances from permitted storage limits for recyclable items
- Provides options for municipalities to request authorization to accept for recycling non-designated materials/waste for which there is a market
- Existing registrations under the MTS GP provides for satellite locations within the municipality
- Specifically for recyclable items paper/cardboard, leaves, grass clippings, glass & metal food containers, plastic containers, fiber beverage containers, textiles and shoes and <u>other recyclables</u> all with written approval

MTS GP Authorizations

• DEEP has authorized:

- Satellite facilities for additional recyclable items clean wood (receipt, storage <u>and processing</u>)
- Regional (multi-town) satellite facilities for textiles operated by 3rd party
- Intent is to provide as flexible and adaptive permitting as possible within the Statutes and Regs.
- Minimize the costs and administrative burden on towns while saving time for both DEEP and Towns
