October 27, 2020 Increase Recycling Working Group Meeting

I. Call to Order and Announcements

Meeting started at 1:00pm.

Co-chairs Laura Francis, First Selectman, Town of Durham and Ben Florsheim, Mayor, City of Middletown provided welcoming remarks, introductions, housekeeping rules and an overview of the Increase Recycling Working Group as part of the CCSMM initiative process.

II. Committee Reports

The co-chairs outlined the goals of the working group meeting. The meeting was intended to: take a look at existing systems and discuss what increase recycling systems are working and what needs improvement; develop materials for municipalities to plan for additional options; and identify local groups to become partners in working to identify and implement these solutions to increase recycling efforts in Connecticut.

The co-chairs also shared "boxed up" solutions for options that are low-cost and convenient for municipalities to implement. These included: textiles collection, swap shops and the CT WRAP program for plastic film collection.

Based on received public comments and suggested topics, the meeting focused on approaches to support municipal recycling leaders and the Bottle Bill.

III. Roundtable

There was opportunity for Q&A of the panelists. Members were interested in how the MassDEP structure of municipal assistance compares with Connecticut as well as opportunities for regional approaches to supporting municipal recycling coordinators.

Members were also interested in the industry involved in the public-private partnership in Oregon's Bottle Bill program, handling fees, recovery rates and contamination rates in Orgon compared to Connecticut. Discussion also focused on green job creation and COVID-19 impacts on Oregon's Bottle Bill system.

Another question asked about mixed deposit rates and nips collection. Glass collection options were also discussed. Others asked about barriers to updating and implementing best collection practices in Connecticut.

The co-chairs shared a list of topics for upcoming meetings and discussion. Members were asked to respond to a poll asking what topics should be discussed at the next meeting. The poll suggested the top two interests were in source-separated glass and shared services. Other top choices were supporting transfer station capacity/ satellite collection system options, banning single use plastics, and public space recycling efforts.

Laura Francis raised the question of COGs as the organizational structures which might allow for housing regional recycling coordination efforts. Other regional groups and partnerships like HRRA were suggested as ways of organizing recycling assistance.

The group also discussed barriers to Bottle Bill modernization efforts in Connecticut. Members described the need for leadership at the local level to act as effective advocates to bring forth municipal support for updates at the legislative level. The lack of materials management leadership at the municipal level was noted, as well as cost barriers to establishing recycling coordinator positions. Laura Francis encouraged the group to consider how to communicate the cost savings element of these initiatives.

Other discussion included next steps, including a request for municipal participants to meet to discuss ideas and suggested topics for upcoming meetings.
