Recycling Laws

- Mandatory Recycling has been required for over twenty years.
- Designated Recyclables include:
 - Paper Products (Boxboard, Cardboard, Newspaper, Magazines, Office Paper, Colored Paper...etc.)
 - Metal and Glass Food & Beverage Containers
 - #1 and #2 Plastic Containers
 - Scrap Metal
 - Batteries (Lead Acid & NI-Cd)
 - Waste Oil
 - Leaves
 - Grass Clippings



Recycling Laws

Public Act 14-94, approved June 2014, requires Department to:

- Revise state-wide Solid Waste Management Plan.
- Include a strategy to divert not less than 60% of solid waste generated in the state by 2024.



CMMS

- Comprehensive Materials Management Strategy (CMMS):
 - Will replace the current Solid Waste Management Plan.
 - Submitted to the General Assembly's Environmental Committee and made available for public comment through April 2016.
 - Undergoing minor revisions in consideration of public comments.
 - Department will adopt by July 1, 2016, make it available on our web-site soon after.
 - Will serve as the "Roadmap" to achieving the state's vision for
 60 percent diversion of materials from disposal by 2024.



CMMS Critical Points

- To achieve the goal of 60% diversion of solid waste from disposal by 2024:
 - The Statewide recycling rate must increase from the current rate of 35%.
 - A stronger program of state-led enforcement is absolutely necessary to achieve the diversion goal.



CTDEEP: Ramping Up

Two internal programs will expand recycling inspection and enforcement efforts.

- 1. Multi-media enforcement coordination
- 2. WEED: Business Recycling Checklist



Multi-media Enforcement Coordination: Training

- Cross media communication and coordination was reviewed, assessed, enhanced and rolled-out in February 2016.
- Field personnel, enforcement analysts & engineers were trained by experts in each media.
- Training included:
 - Detailed Regulatory overview
 - Visuals of "What to Look For in the Field"
 - Recycling was covered in detail



Multi-media Enforcement Coordination: Roll-out

Field personnel from all media, will now observe:

- 1. Is the business lacking an established Recycling Program?
- 2. Is the business lacking more than one container at the "Back of the Building" to collect Designated Recyclables separately from trash?
- 3. Is there more than an incidental amount of Designated Recyclables in trash containers or dumpsters?

WEED: Business Recycling Checklists

- Much more intensive, performed by WEED field personnel.
- Comprehensive Evaluation Inspections at:
 - Large Quantity Generators
 - Small Quantity Generators
 - All Treatment Disposal Facilities.
- Other Discretionary Inspections:
 - Sector Analyses:
 - Multi-tenant Housing
 - Retail Stores
 - Franchises
 - Complaints.



WEED: Business Recycling Checklist

Comprehensive checklist:

All items covered by multi-media observations, plus the following:

- Does the company have a "recycling or green team"?
- Are there adequate recycling collection areas internal to the facility?
- Are there Recycling contracts in place?
- Itemized list of Designated Recyclables generated at the facility and identification of whether or not they are recycled.





Recycling Initiative TEAM

- Meet Weekly to assess all Recycling Notifications
 - Complaints;
 - Multi-media Referrals;
 - Completed WEED Business Recycling Checklists.
- Determine the appropriate course of action:
 - Gather Additional Information;
 - Provide Compliance Assistance; or
 - Provide an Enforcement Response.



Where are we now?

- Two internal programs: More trained eyes in the field.
- Recycling Initiative Team: Meets weekly.
- Dozens of completed WEED Checklists since April.
- Several NONs & NOVs have been or are prepared to be issued.
- Common Violations:
 - No "Recycling Plan" in place.
 - No internal recycling containers.
 - No external recycling containers ("back of the building").
 - Recycling cardboard only, other recyclable items mixed in with trash.
