## How Many Types of Waste in CT?

- Hazardous Waste
- Non-RCRA-Hazardous Connecticut-Regulated Waste
- Special Waste
- Solid Waste

#### Hazardous Waste

- Federally-regulated under 40 CFR 260-279.
- State regulations:
  RCSA Sections 22a-449(c)-100 through -110 and -11.
- Federal RCRA wastes.
- Certain CT-specific hazardous wastes.
- Described in DEEP Web Page "What is Hazardous Waste?"
- Requirements outlined on <u>DEEP HW Web Page</u>.

# "Connecticut-Regulated" Wastes

- Connecticut General Statutes <u>Section 22a-454</u>.
- Requires permits for persons "engaged in the business" of collecting, storing, treating, or disposing of certain wastes, including:
  - "waste oil or petroleum or chemical liquids or <u>hazardous</u> waste"
  - "waste solid, liquid, or gaseous products."
- Terms defined in CGS <u>Section 22a-448</u>.
- Described in <u>DEEP Fact Sheet</u>.
- No real requirements for generators, as with HW.

## Special Waste

- Defined in <u>CT's Solid Waste Regulations</u>.
- Includes the following non-hazardous wastes:
  - Water treatment, sewage treatment or industrial sludges, liquid, solids and contained gases;
  - Fly ash and casting sands or slag;
  - Contaminated dredge spoils;
  - Scrap tires;
  - Bulky waste;
  - Asbestos;
  - Residue (i.e., ash from trash-to-energy plants);
  - Biomedical Waste.

#### Solid Waste

- Defined in CT's Solid Waste Regulations.
- RCSA Section 22a-209-1:
  - "Unwanted or discarded solid, liquid, semi-solid or contained gaseous material, including, but not limited to, demolition debris, material burned or otherwise processed at a resources recovery facility or incinerator, material processed at a recycling facility and sludges or other residue from a water pollution abatement facility, water supply treatment plant, or air pollution control facility.
- Types of Solid Waste:
  - Municipal Solid Waste
  - Special Waste
