Most manifests... (~97%)




... are still stored in paper format



~ 3% manifests have been scanned

Scanned images from 3 years:2012 - 2014



Stored in "Filenet"

 electronic document repository

• Accessible in DEEP Records Center computers



2-year plan:

100% digital by 2018

- Scan all remaining paper manifests
 ~ 1.2 million+
 - Scanning contractor already started








What do I do until 2018?

2 sources to search to get copies:
1) Manifest FOIA (1984 – 2008)
2) Filenet (2012 – 2014)



NOTE: Unavailable –

- 1981 1984; 2009 2011; 2015 present
- in boxes / not in any database



Where are these data available?

Data Source	Years	DEEP Records Center	On Line
Manifest FOIA	1984 - 2008	Yes	Yes
Filenet	2012 - 2014	Yes	No

- Replaces ftp site download
- "giant spreadsheet" easier to search
- Downloadable ~ 900,000 records / 35 Mb
- ONLY data from Manifest FOIA 1984 2008
- Still need to visit DEEP for Filenet 2012 2014
