Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection

Organics Recycling Law (CGS 22a-226e)

- Applies to food wholesalers, distributors, manufacturers, processors, supermarkets, resorts & conference centers that:
- Generate an average projected volume of 52 tons/yr of source separated organics (new as of 01/01/20), and are
- Within 20 miles of a SSOM processing facility.
- Must source separate and ensure recycling "at any authorized SSOM composting facility" that has available capacity and can accept food scrap.



Urban Mining Northeast Update

- Beneficial Use Determination (BUD) Approval for the beneficial use of a solid waste in the manufacturing process.
- Building facility in Beacon Falls, CT.
- Glass to be used primarily as Pozzolan in concrete.
- Glass to be sourced from CT facilities and surrounding regional facilities.
- Plant Capacity: 31,000 TPY
- Start-up in May/June 2020?




MIRA Redevelopment Update

- MIRA shared a presentation with towns on 01/08
- Presentation is posted on MIRA's website
- MIRA sent letter to CEOs of member towns on Monday 01/27. From MIRA's posted presentation:
 - Municipal Customers will receive a proposed Statement of Interest, which when executed commits the town to consider participation in the project provided certain terms and prices are guaranteed.
 - This non binding town promise is necessary to confirm project viability and commence financing.
