3. Discussion

- Overall, it seemed that this data was interesting but unclear if we should dig any deeper.
- Would an e-directory be helpful? Would this be a great way to find the market (ie manufacturers) and the manufacturers to find the processors?
- Without any reps of manufacturers at the meeting, it sounds like it's not the lack of markets (ie manufacturers) that are already known – but rather the use (ie procurement).
- Should we focus on procurement?
- What about glass? We have too much glass and not enough markets? How can we find new ways or markets to use these?
- What about creating new markets and strengthen existing ones for glass?
- It would be great if we could use more glass in highway projects.
- Should we just focus on highway projects in terms of procurement working with DOT to use glass, shingles, compost etc?
- Highway projects are too limiting glass is a big problem. Would be helpful
 to know more about current and existing markets and how to bring new
 markets to our area.
- Glass can be used in highway construction but also insulation, septic sand, beaches?
- How to make a better glass product?
- If we took glass out of our single stream collection it would clean up the paper making paper mills happier. Not sure how we would do this. Take glass out of collection?

- So we should just focus on glass? With our limited resources we should look into researching more about glass – folks felt this would be a good decision but with small turnout – Sherill suggested checking into with a couple of other members.
- Sherill was asked to check in with DOT/UCONN pavement lab about how much money would be needed to do some research projects connected to using glass.
- Options for next steps:
 - a. Research Glass Markets in General
 - b. Research Glass for just highway project uses
- c. Research/coordination conversations with DOT and pavement lab about just highway projects, looking at a number of ways to increase use/require procurement including glass, shingles, compost and other
