Overview

- Effective Oct. 1, 2021
- Wholesalers must assess a \$0.05 fee on all miniature alcohol bottles sold to retailers
- Revenues from the \$0.05 fee are disbursed by the Wine & Spirits Wholesalers of CT (WSWC) on behalf of wholesalers to municipalities each April and October (began April 2022)



A Reminder

- Miniatures are not part of the deposit redemption system
- No state involvement aside from receiving semiannual report from wholesalers/WSWC

How can these funds be used by municipalities?

 Public Act 21-58 specifies that "All payments received by any municipality... shall be expended by such municipality on environmental measures intended to reduce the generation of solid waste in such municipality or reduce the impact of litter caused by such solid waste, including, but not limited to, the hiring of a recycling coordinator, the installation of storm drain filters designed to block solid waste and beverage container debris or the purchase of mechanical street sweeper, vacuum or broom that removes litter, including, but not limited to, such beverage containers and other debris from streets, sidewalks and abutting lawn and turf areas."



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Overview

- PA 21-58 Sec. 9 created a pathway for the formation of a stewardship organization constituted by deposit initiators in the state
- The prospective stewardship organization would have to submit an application to DEEP and submit a draft stewardship plan to DEEP by July 1, 2022



Current Status

- Application for a stewardship organization received by DEEP in January 2022
 - Awaiting verification of one of the criteria from PA21-58
- Draft Stewardship Plan received by DEEP on July 1, 2022



Next Steps

- DEEP expects to be able to approve the organization's application soon
- DEEP has asked the applicant to provide an updated stewardship plan
- DEEP intends to release the updated stewardship plan for a public comment period



Of Note

- By law, once the organization is approved all deposit initiators in the state shall register with and join the organization
- By law, DEEP cannot approve a plan unless it has received input from specific industry stakeholders
- DEEP does not intend to put forward any Legislation pertaining to the bottle bill in 2023

3. Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program



Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program

Overview

- The 2021 budget created Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program to provide up to \$5 million in grants for redemption centers
- Targets new redemption center owners, locally-, minority-, and women-owned
- Eligible only in Environmental Justice Communities



Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program

Current Status

- Application period closed on October 3, 2022
- 16 applications received
- DEEP bringing on a vendor to administer the program

Upcoming Changes to the Bottle Bill

January 1, 2023

 Covered beverages expand to include items such as juices, teas, sports drinks, coffee drinks, energy drinks, and more

January 1, 2024

Deposit increases from \$0.05 to \$0.10
