School Recycling Grant recipients, December 2021:

High School in the Community, New Haven, \$1590

On-site composting program; engaging students; collecting food scraps and use finished compost in their school gardens.

Mill Hill Elementary, Southport, \$2000

Funds for supplies and equipment for on-site composting program that includes books for classrooms. Finished compost to be used in school gardens.

Northeast Elementary, Stamford, \$2000

Working to reduce the amount of waste and need for single-use items; signage; reusable snack containers and reusable water bottles for students.

Suffield High School, Suffield, \$2000

Using waste audit results from last year, building on-site composting program; educational materials; collecting food scraps.

Steward Outdoor Day School, Ivoryton, \$627.79

On-site composting program; collecting food scraps.

Staples High School, Westport, \$1500

Funds to build onsite structure, signage, compostable bags and other equipment.

Thames River Magnet, Groton, \$1530

Funds for equipment and lumber to build on-site food scrap collection for worm composting and outdoor compost system, guest speaker and signage.
