CT DEEP Staff,

The Durham portion of the current water quality classification map has been reviewed. Two areas of contribution to public supply wells (blue hashed circles) no longer exist. One is located adjacent to Fowler Brook, east of Cherry Lane. The other is located northwest of the intersection of Route 79 and Route 17/Main Street. At one time those bedrock wells were supplies for the Durham Center Water System. The wells were abandoned when the Durham Center Water System was upgraded (with State grants) and began to utilize two high yielding wells located in the Coginchaug River valley on the White Farm, west of Maple Avenue. Further, these two wells will be discontinued within the next 3 years due to a water main extension from the City of Middletown that will serve the "Durham Meadows Superfund Area" and connect to the Durham Center Water System.
