The NRWA is prepared to defend that right and to act as a voice of public concern in protecting the air, water and land in the watershed.

Thank you for this opportunity to offer comments concerning this Revision.

NRWA believes that the revised language on nutrient standards is weak and should be strengthened. Nutrient standards should be distinct from drinking-water standards

NRWA requests that numeric criteria for phosphorus be included.

Please strengthen -- 19) Point and non-point sources of phosphorus and nitrogen. Other sections on nutrient loading are not definitive.

Please clarify "natural" in -- 8. Water Quality Criteria do not apply to certain conditions brought about by natural causes. Natural hydrologic and geologic conditions ... Suggest that the definition of "natural" not be dependent on economic and institutional deliberations.

What are the goals/objectives of Standard 9? The new language would allow discharge of domestic sewage to surface waters classified A or SA.
