

APPLICATION FOR BLACK BEAR AGRICULTURAL DAMAGE PERMITS

(**Note**: Applicants must have already attempted the best practices for non-lethal methods that DEEP has outlined on the <u>bear agricultural damage webpage</u> and must have consulted with a DEEP wildlife biologist before applying for a permit.)

<u>Section 26-47(e)</u> of the General Statutes allows the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) to issue permits for the take of bears that threaten to cause or are causing damage to agricultural crops, livestock, or apiaries, under certain conditions.

Bear agricultural damage permits will only be issued if the application meets all requirements, including proof that the owner or lessee of the subject property has made reasonable, non-lethal efforts to protect crops, livestock, or apiaries. DEEP personnel will conduct an investigation to determine if a permit is necessary to protect crops, livestock, or apiaries from damage and if reasonable, non-lethal efforts to protect such crops, livestock, or apiaries have not been, or are not likely to be, successful in preventing damage. Any permits issued will specify the permissible means, methods, and times of take. Any bears taken shall be disposed of as directed by DEEP officials.

To apply for a bear agricultural damage permit, all landowners listed on the subject property deed(s) must complete and sign the application.

All landowners and lessees must be the same for all properties identified in the application. A single application may cover multiple properties owned/operated by the same landowner(s) and lessee(s). Separate applications must be submitted for multiple properties owned/operated by separate landowner(s) and/or separate lessee(s), even where there's partial overlap among owners/lessees. A permit may be issued to the landowner, an agent of such owner, or the lessee of the subject property, provided such agent or lessee has written permission from such owner to take wildlife.

You must answer all of the following questions accurately and completely in order for us to process your application. Incomplete applications will not be processed. All landowners, and/or lessees listed will be emailed when an application has been processed and has been either approved or denied. If landowners and/or lessee cannot provide an email address, they will be notified by phone.

Part IX: Authorized Shooter Information

Black bear damage permits may list no more than 3 persons, including the landowner, lessee, or agent of the owner, at any one time as authorized shooters. Approved shooters must not have any hunting and trapping violations in the past three years. While executing the objectives of the damage permit, all authorized shooters listed on this form must have relevant landowner permission and a valid CT Conservation Identification Number and either

- 1. show proof of successfully completing a Connecticut Conservation Education Firearms Safety Course or its equivalent OR
- 2. have a valid CT Hunting License,

It is very important that the landowner, authorized lessee, and/or agent have a valid email address, as notification of application approval will be emailed. Once notification is sent and received, all agricultural damage permits will be provided by email or can be picked up in person from Sessions Woods Wildlife Management Area in Burlington, CT. An authorized shooter must carry a physical copy of a permit whenever engaging in permitted activities.
