Do Not Feed Waterfow

Feeding of waterfowl is NOT beneficial – it has negative ecological, environmental, and social consequences

Feeding of wild waterfowl can lead to:

Delayed Migration

- Waterfowl's natural instincts are disturbed
- Birds may overstay their welcome

Malnutrition

- Decreased reproductive rates
- Development of deformed (propeller) wings
- Increased susceptibility to predation
- Loss of flight ability
- Lowered life expectancy

Spread of Disease

• Avian influenza (bird flu)



• Avian cholera

Botulism

Duck viral enteritis

Hybridization

• Hybridization between domestic and wild waterfowl compromises the integrity of wild populations

Public Safety Concerns

- Dangerous and unpredictable behavior
- Vehicle strikes

Reduced Water Quality

- Algal blooms
- Accumulation of droppings
- Fecal coliform bacteria
- Overgrazing of vegetation
- Swimmer's itch



Support efforts of federal, state, and private organizations to conserve waterfowl and waterfowl habitat.

Purchase a Connecticut Duck Stamp from your local town hall, online, or a DEEP Licensing Center to provide funds for the purchase and restoration of natural habitats for waterfowl.

Since the debut of the Connecticut Duck Stamp Program in 1993, over 3,545 acres of inland and tidal wetlands have been restored or enhanced, and important upland buffer areas associated with wetlands have been acquired.
