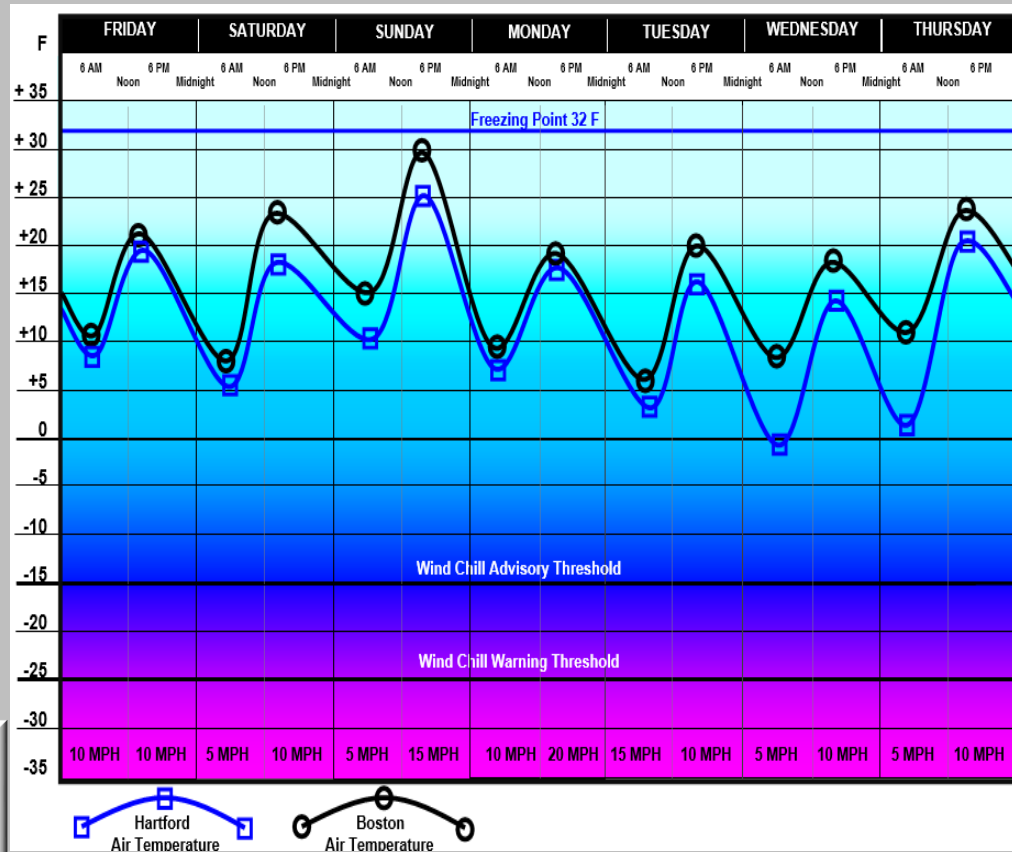
TODAY'S WEATHER FORECAST

UNSEASONABLE ARCTIC COLD OUTBREAK FORECAST TO CONTINUE...COLD WEATHER PROTOCOL IN EFFECT FOR AT LEAST THE NEXT 7 DAYS...

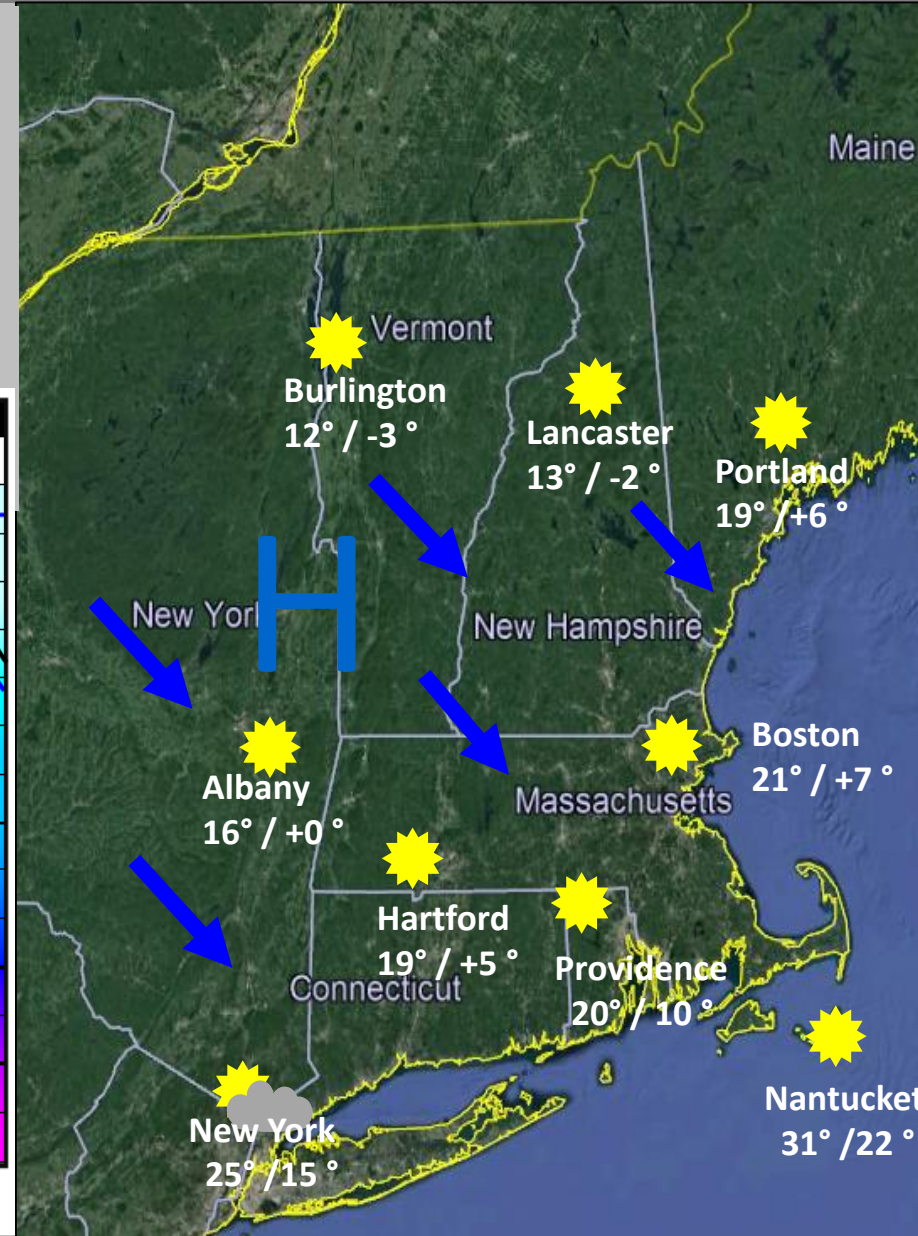
Arctic air has now settled in across New England resulting in record cold temperatures for mid-November. Temperatures at 8:30 AM currently range from near 0 F in Northern New England up to the low teens along the coast. Northwest winds are currently sustained at 10 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH at times. High temperatures today are only expected to reach the low teens in northern New England and around 20 F in southern New England. Wind chills will range between +5 and +15 F today. For tonight, the northwest winds will subside to around 5 MPH with overnight lows dropping below 0 F in northern New England up to around +10 F along the coast. DEMHS has activated the cold weather protocol for at least the next 7 days.

The forecast for the next 7 days (see graph to the right for the Boston and Hartford areas) is for a continued and prolonged arctic cold weather pattern with near record low temperatures. Overnight lows are forecast to be near 0 F in northern New England and in the single digits during the days. Daytime highs are forecast to range from near 10 F in northern New England to the upper teens and low 20's in southern New England for most days. Wind chills are forecast to drop below zero during the nights and hover in the single digits during the days. No large storms are in the forecast and no significant precipitation is expected during the next 7 days.

We will continue to closely monitor this arctic outbreak and will send out another update Tuesday morning at 8:30 AM.
