Eligible Applicants : An organization described under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code through the application that the organization is at high risk of a terrorist attack. Applicant must own or lease the facility.	Eligible Applicants: A 501 (c) (3) organization the DESPP Commissioner determines is at heightened risk of being the target of a terrorist attack, hate crime or violent act. * Applicant must own the facility.
Maximum Application/Award amount: \$150,000.00 per facility (up to 3 facilities)	Maximum Application/Award amount: \$50,000.00 per facility (no limit on number of facilities)
Period of Performance: approximately 30 months	Period of Performance: <u>Retroactive</u> to 7/1/2019 – approximately 24 months from award date
Allowable Projects: Physical Security Improvements in FEMA Authorized Equipment List* Section 14 & 15, public address/handheld radios, Hired Security Services, Planning, Exercises and Training. Up to 5% allowable for maintenance and administration costs. *(https://fema.gov/grants/guidance- tools/authorized-equipment-list)	Allowable Projects: equipment and property for security infrastructure improvements, including, but not limited to, cameras, fencing, window film, security vestibules, alarms and access control systems, vendor provided training on purchased equipment, .
Ineligible Costs: overtime,organizational operating costs, direct hiring of public safety personnel	Ineligible Costs: fire alarms, non-vendor provided training, operational costs
Historic Review: ALL awarded facilities must complete an Environmental Historic Preservation (EHP) review	Historic Review: ALL awarded facilities 50 years and older must complete State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) review
