<b>Maximum Application/Award amount:</b> \$150,000.00 per facility (up to 3 facilities)	<b>Maximum Application/Award amount:</b> \$50,000.00 per facility (no limit on number of facilities)
<b>Period of Performance:</b> approximately 30 months	<b>Period of Performance:</b> <u>Retroactive</u> to 7/1/2019 – approximately 24 months from award date
<b>Allowable Projects:</b> Physical Security Improvements in FEMA Authorized Equipment List* Section 14 & 15, public address/handheld radios, Hired Security Services, Planning, Exercises and Training. Up to 5% allowable for maintenance and administration costs. *( <a href="https://fema.gov/grants/guidance-tools/authorized-equipment-list">https://fema.gov/grants/guidance-tools/authorized-equipment-list</a> )	<b>Allowable Projects:</b> equipment and property for security infrastructure improvements, including, but not limited to, cameras, fencing, window film, security vestibules, alarms and access control systems, vendor provided training on purchased equipment, .
<b>Ineligible Costs:</b> overtime,organizational operating costs, direct hiring of public safety personnel	<b>Ineligible Costs:</b> fire alarms, non-vendor provided training, operational costs
<b>Historic Review:</b> ALL awarded facilities must complete an Environmental Historic Preservation (EHP) review	<b>Historic Review:</b> ALL awarded facilities 50 years and older must complete State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) review
<b>Application:</b> 4 parts 1. Investment Justification 2. Organization's Mission Statement 3. Vulnerability Assessment 4. Security Self-Assessment Survey	<b>Application:</b> 2 parts 1. Application, including budget, narrative, organization data, and threat information 2. Security Self-Assessment
