Nuclear Safety Emergency Funding (NSEF)

History:

The NSEP was created by Public Act 81-409 in 1981

Eligible Recipients:

Municipalities located in the Emergency Preparedness Zone (EPZ) surrounding Millstone, the Host Communities of West Hartford and New Haven and UCONN. DEEP, DEMHS and several other state agencies also receive funding.

Purpose:

To support the Radiological Emergency Preparedness (REP) and Response Program in Connecticut. The REP program and associated plans address emergency planning and preparedness for fixed nuclear facilities and/or spent fuel storage sites at Millstone Station in Waterford, CT, Connecticut Yankee in Haddam, CT and Indian Point in Buchanan, NY.

Range of Eligible Projects/Example of Successful Projects:

Municipal governments in the EPZ and host communities utilize NSEP funding to maintain full capability and readiness to respond to incidents at the Millstone Nuclear Power Station.

Grant Best Practices/FAQ:

Other capabilities that are supported include communications equipment, dosimetry, traffic control for evacuation and recurring services such as high-speed internet, phones and radios.

Funds available:

Approximately 5 million dollars annually based on approved budgets from DEEP, DEMHS, EPZ Towns and Host Communities.
