State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) – CALL FOR PROJECTS for State Fiscal

Year 2021 Financing – **DEADLINE EXTENDED to April 30** 

The Department of Public Health's Drinking Water Section (DWS) is extending the due date for its call for eligible drinking water projects for potential funding through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) during State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2020. The Call for Projects notice is available on the <a href="DPH website">DPH website</a> with a new deadline of **April 30, 2020** to submit Eligibility Applications for consideration for the SFY 2021 Project Priority List (PPL). The PPL details the projects that DPH is expecting to commit the available DWSRF funds during SFY 2021. Applications received after that deadline will be assigned appropriate priority points according to the DWSF <a href="Priority Ranking System">Priority Ranking System</a> and periodically (expected to be done quarterly) added to the DPH's Comprehensive Project List (CPL). If you have an eligible drinking water construction project that will be ready to proceed during the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021 you are strongly encouraged to submit your application as early as possible but no later than April 30.
