SUBJECT: Proposed Lead and Copper Rule Improvements

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has published the Proposed Lead and Copper Rule Improvements (LCRI) on December 6, 2023 in the Federal Register. The proposed LCRI is a new federal rule proposed by EPA to strengthen the current Lead and Copper Rule to reduce lead in drinking water to protect children and adults from the significant, and irreversible, health effects from being exposed to lead in drinking water. A 60-day public comment period is available for the public to submit written comments to EPA on the proposed LCRI. Community and non-transient non-community public water systems are encouraged to review the proposed LCRI and provide written comments to EPA by February 5, 2024 at Federal Register:: National Primary Drinking Water Regulations for Lead and Copper: Improvements (LCRI).
