As the State continues to recover from tropical storm Isaias numerous public water systems remain without power. As a reminder, all bulk water deliveries used for potable water (including temporary drinking water filling stations) must be supplied by water haulers approved by the department. A bulk water hauling notification form must be completed by the public water system and submitted to the DPH to provide notification when bulk water hauling is required at a public water system. The list of licensed water haulers and bulk water hauling notification form are found here:
