

As of September 15, 2018



### **REPLICA State Eligibility**





### Individual Eligibility & Practice

- Licensed in a Home State as an EMT, AEMT\* or Paramedic
- Practicing in good standing in their home state(s)
- Under the supervision of an EMS Medical Director
- Using home state protocols
- At least **18** years of age





### Interstate Commission for EMS Personnel Practice

- Oversight of Compact operations
- Governmental body
- Member states have one seat, one vote
- Rulemaking authority on Compact related matters only





### National EMS Coordinated Database (NEMSCD)

- Legal authorization provided by the REPLICA legislation
- State EMS Office Can:
  - View complete (multiple state) license history of individuals
  - Share real-time significant investigatory information
  - Share License Discipline History
  - Receive cross-border notifications of out of state adverse actions

### Relationship to the Emergency Management Assistance Compact



Once a Governor declares a disaster and EMAC is activated, EMAC applies and no terms or provisions of REPLICA shall supersede the terms of EMAC on NAC with respect to any individual practicing in the remote state in response to such declaration


