Rick spoke about the per capita CMED funding received by the centers, he has towns that he provides CMED service to that he does not have contracts with but who do assign their CMED credit to VSECI. He would like to charge those towns a per call fee to help cover infrastructure costs in fairness to the member towns but is experiencing push back. Discussion followed on whether there is anything that requires a town to contract for CMED services and the difficulty in ceasing service for a member or nonmember town.
