She explained the concern for managing situations when the area surrounding a facility maybe unsafe for EMS units and the hospital is not on diversion.	
Statewide CMED Manual/Directory	D. Racicot circulated final draft of the CMED maps showing towns, hospitals, coordinating and patch channel for each CMED. G. Prevost circulated the CMED System Overview and Listing of Hospitals Statewide. B. Morris reported that she is editing the introduction and general radio operating procedures. The EMS Advisory Board is anticipating release of the final draft.

CMED Work Group – P25 Project	A discussion ensued about investing in equipment compatible with the State P25 to improve UHF radio coverage. G. Prevost and S. Wright will draft a one-page summary on the beta test results. In many areas of the state, replacing the MED channel radio system along with improving coverage is cost prohibitive. Understanding that all EMS vehicles must have a UHF CMED radio to be compliant with the State standard, CMEDs/RCCs are seeking cost effective ways to improve and support the MED channel radio system. B Morris and D. Racicot will develop questions to survey the EMS community about their CMED radio replacement plan. G. Prevost will work with D. Soule and submit a request for assistance from CTS.
