Meeting called to order at 1:33 p.m.	Presented Minutes of the June 8, 2022 Meeting  Guests: Joel Demers, DPH/OEMS joined the meeting.	Motion to approve (Dumas) seconded (Kelleher) - Minutes approved.
Update on TWIAGE (Mobile App for EMS to Hospital Communications)	B. Morris requested that each CMED/RCC give an update on the use of Twiage in their areas. QV/C. Kelleher reported a small impact. They process minimum med patches. The dispatch center has a monitor to view Twiage activity as seen by the hospital. He reiterated the concern that this practice could result in a lack of situational awareness with destination hospitals. We don't want to lose coordination capability for MCI communication and managing transportation flow to the hospitals. SWRC/V. Dumas reported that one hospital is using Twiage along with it's primary service. It's a busy hospital and multiple ambulances transport patients to them. Controlling the information flow is challenging. NWPS/S. Savage reported that they are concerned about losing situational awareness. NW needs to address the units that do not sign on with them. North Central CMED/B. Morris reported that Twiage set up a dashboard with a similar view that the hospital ED has that we can pilot test. It is under construction and not available in the communications center at this time.NC EMS providers continue to follow procedures for signing on and	

	providing hospital destination. This helps with situational awareness particularly when they respond to MCIs.	
	Common concerns are the potential for multiple apps, loss of situational	
	awareness, maintaining MCI coordination for destination hospitals and	
	acknowledgement of Twiage calls by emergency department personnel.
