They will offer NRP approval to anyone who has received state EMS office approval and is proposing to allow non accredited Paramedic programs. This is not supported by this State. Several states have threatened to pull out of NREMT because the accreditation process is too difficult. Recommended to provide feedback to registry saying we are against this proposal. Advisory needs to approve / support this recommendation. The State will not accept a program that is not accredited. However, there is concern that someone can seek reciprocity and never attended an accredited program. Michael has found articles supporting accredited individuals provide better patient outcomes. Joel stated this is currently being used in NY and they are using the Stratified LA Scale (SLAMS) and anyone with a score of 4 or higher is transported to an interventional site. The proposal in CT is still using the Cincinnati Stroke Scale and anyone with a 3 goes to an interventional site.
