Looking at data on course completion rates and time to submit T6 Form – discussion on eliminating the T6 form Skills only required for "active" status with NREMT, mirrored by CT requirements currently but not explicitly a regulatory requirement Practicing providers have a training officer and medical director. Most agencies have systems in place to monitor skills but small agencies struggle with maintaining proficiency and non-practicing providers do not have any mechanism for this.
