Phase I & II Subsurface Sewage Disposal System Local Health Agent Training Courses Re:

Department staff will be conducting training courses for local health agents involved with subsurface sewage disposal system (SSDS) investigations, inspections, and plan approvals. The courses are open to sanitarians, local health officials, and other municipal officials currently employed by a local health department and/or a municipality in the capacity of regulating SSDSs. Attendance of the training sessions and successful completion of the examination is required for all SSDS regulatory officials pursuant to Public Health Code Section 19-13-B103e(b)(2). If space allows local health agents already Phase I or Phase II approved may attend these trainings as a refresher with approval from their Local Director of Health; full attendance for a refresher is not required.

Training sessions are from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM and will be held online and in person at the South Windsor EOC. Preregistration for the training is required. Registration will be through TRAIN at https://ct.train.org. Existing TrainCT users should login to their account using their current username and password. New users will need to create a new member profile. After login, the training courses will be listed in the upcoming events.
