Denise Ortiz was recently published in the Journal of Public Health Management and Practice. In 2017, the FDA issued a safety recall for the Magellan Diagnostics' LeadCare Testing System due to the potential for erroneously low blood lead test results when used with venous blood samples. As a consequence, the CDC issued a health alert including recommendations for specific high-risk populations. Denise and colleagues in three other states wrote up case studies documenting concerns they found when the

LeadCare equipment was used to analyze venous blood draws. During Denise's investigation, CT DPH became concerned with error rates and inconsistencies between LeadCare package inserts and the Advisory Committee on Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention's (ACCLPP) recommendations for confirmatory tests. In January 2016, the CT DPH notified pediatricians and hospital laboratories that venous results from LeadCare instruments were not an acceptable form of confirmation.
