# Referring Well Water Quality Complaints to DEEP

CT's Potable Water Law
Connecticut General Statutes
Section 22a-471

DEEP investigates complaints regarding potential impacts to drinking water wells as the result of man-made sources of pollution




#### Overview

- 2014 increase in complaints relating to elevated sodium and chloride in private wells
- Typical concentrations in road salt impacted drinking water wells:
  - Sodium = 100 600+ mg/L
     (100 mg/L Guidance)
  - Chloride = 300 1,600+ mg/L
     (250 mg/L MCL)






#### Overview





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~130 impacted wells identified within past 5 years all attributed (primarily) to road salt applications


#### Sodium & Chloride Well Water Complaints

#### Questions to ask well owner

- 1. Has the well been tested recently?
  - Recommend full potability scan
  - Evaluate changes in water quality (past vs. recent)
- 2. Water treatment/filtration present?
- 3. Well construction
- 4. Contact information for well owner
  - OK to share with DEEP/DPH?

#### Referrals to DEEP

#### Information to send

- 1. Water quality data for affected wells
  - Past & present
- 2. Well completion report
- 3. Any additional notes/observations
  - Water treatment (assess backwash location)
  - Topography
  - Road drainage
  - Maps/Photographs



# DEEP's Investigation

- Well water sampling/data review
- > File Review:
  - √ Well completion reports
  - √ Well water quality reports
- Geologic mapping data:
  - ✓ aerial photos
  - √ bedrock geologic map
  - ✓ surficial geology map
- Well-head inspection
- Water treatment system use/backwash?



# DEEP's Investigation (cont.)

- ➤ Topography/road drainage
  - ✓ Curbing
  - ✓ Storm water system
  - ✓ Drainage swales/outfalls
- Road salting policy/practices
  - ✓ Application rates
  - ✓ Snow plowing BMPs
- Further well testing



# DEEP's Investigation (cont.)

#### **Source Determination**

22a-471 <u>requires</u> the Responsible Party to provide a short-term supply and long-term solution for safe supply of drinking water

- Meet with State DOT or local DPW to discuss complaint
- Engage local health departments to assist town officials
- > Collaborate to find solutions to reduce impacts to well



#### Short and Long-term Solutions for Road Salt Impacted Wells

#### Short-term:

- Providing bottled water
- Roadway drainage improvements
- Road salt application BMPs
- Source removal
- On-going monitoring of well water quality

#### Long-term:

- Secondary well seal
- Drilling a new well
- Connecting to public water
- Community well
- > POU or POE treatment (Reverse osmosis)
