The **Connecticut State Board of Chiropractic Examiners** held a meeting at the Department of Health at 410 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, CT on September 12, 2019 in the third floor Hearing Room.

Dr. Carroccia called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

I. <u>MINUTES</u>

Dr. Carucci made a motion, seconded by Dr. Boghosian, to approve the minutes from the May 16, 2019 meeting. The motion passed.

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. <u>Reinstatement after practicing with a lapsed license</u>

Stephen Carragher, Public Services Manager, DPH Practitioner Licensing Unit explained the current policy regarding practitioners who have continued to practice after their license has expired and are seeking reinstatement. The current policy requires a reinstatement consent order which imposes a reprimand and a civil penalty which is calculated based on the time period the practitioner has continued to practice.

Dr. Boghosian made a motion, seconded by Dr. Carucci to endorser DPH's current policy/ The motion passed unanimously.

III. OLD BUSINESS

A. <u>Declaratory Ruling – FAA BasicMed Examination</u>

Board Liaison Jeffrey Kardys reported that the written draft is being reviewed by the Assistant Attorney General.

B. Board meetings at the University of Bridgeport School of Chiropractic

Board Liaison Jeffrey Kardys reported that Assistant Attorney General Henry Salton indicated that the Board could hold a future meeting at the University of Bridgeport School of Chiropractic provided there is no discussion regarding examinations for licensure, the accreditation of schools of Chiropractic, scope of practice or matters that may potentially come before the Board for adjudication.

Dr. Boghosian provided an overview of the Federation of Chiropractic Licensing Boards annual meeting he attended from May 1 to May 5, 2019.

The Board discussed the possibility of hold a future Board meeting at the University of Bridgeport so that Chiropractic Students can attend.

IV. OPEN FORUM

Dr. Boghosian, DC initiated discussion regarding the use of CBD Oil, designation as a Chiropractic Specialist, Stem Cell Therapy, and the inclusion of a link to the Federation of Chiropractic Licensing Boards Providers of Approved Continuing Education (PACE) program on the Board's web page. No motions were made and no votes were taken regarding these issues.
