A. Legislation change from 3 to 4 hours of continuing education units for CPR hours to coincide with the American Heart Association guideline. Note for files, requested was made on September 4, 2016.

B. A statutory change to allow for the use of initials for each field that we are licensed by the State of Connecticut as well as "L.E." initials for Licensed Electrologist. Steve Carragher will check with government regulations to pursue this option. Once in Legislation we will notify CT State Electrolysis Association and they can contact their legislators for support.
