CONNECTICUT MEDICAL EXAMINING BOARD MINUTES of July 16, 2019

The Connecticut Medical Examining Board held a meeting on Tuesday, July 16, 2019 at the Legislative Office Building, 300 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut in conference room 2-B.

Ms. Emmett called the meeting to order at 1:34 p.m.

I. MINUTES

The draft minutes of the May 21, 2019 meeting were reviewed. Dr. Green made a motion, seconded by Mr. Andrews to approve the minutes as edited. The motion passed with all in favor except Dr. Duffy and Dr. Zeman, who abstained.

B. <u>Department of Public Health</u>

Christian Andresen, Section Chief, Department of Public Health was present to discuss issues raised by Board Member Jean Rexford at the last meeting.

Mr. Andresen reported that the DPH is reviewing the issue of Licensure Compact. The Connecticut State Medical Society has been contracted for input. The Medical Society does not have a position at this time.

Mr. Andresen indicated that criminal background checks for physicians are not required by statute. For those professions that background checks are required, the Connecticut State police is the authority required to perform this task. There is a proposal to allow private contractors to perform background checks because this process is putting a strain on State Police resources.

Civil Penalties collected from disciplinary actions are sent to the State of Connecticut General Fund. To designate the monies collected for licensure purposes would require a statutory change.

IV. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

A. Criteria for license reinstatement/reentry to practice.

Stephen Carragher, Public Health Services Manager, Office of Practitioner Licensing and Certification reported that the Federation of State Medical Boards, Special Purpose Examination (SPEX) is used by 17 state on a case by case basis for practitioners who have been out of clinical practice from anywhere between 2 and 10 years. Other conditions required by states include current continuing education, practice monitoring upon return to practice, personal interviews, competency evaluations, and passing of Specialty Board certification examinations.

The Board would like to explore the issuance reinstatement quid lines or adoption of the Federation of State Medical Boards guidelines for physician reinstatement.

Andrew Mendenhall, MD – Review of License Reinstatement Application

Celeste Dowdell, License and Applications Analyst, Department of Public Health presented a license reinstatement application for Andrew Mendenhall, MD.

Dr. Green made a motion, seconded by Mr. McAnaney, recommending that Dr. Mendenhall's license reinstatement be approved. The motion unanimously.

V. OFFICE OF LEGAL COMPLIANCE

A. James Bucci, MD - Petition No. 2017-1049

Staff Attorney David Tilles, Department of Public Health, presented a Consent Order in this matter. Attorney Gregory Gagne was present on behalf of respondent. A Consent Order in this matter was rejected at the May 21, 2019 meeting and revisions were suggested.

Mr. McAnaney made a motion, seconded by Dr. Katz, to adopt this Consent Order as written. The motion passed with all in favor except Dr. Patel who abstained.

Ms. Emmett signed the Order which imposes a reprimand, an \$8000.00 civil penalty and requires respondent not to reinstate his controlled substance registration.

B. William Guinan, MD - Petition No. 2017-1476

Staff Attorney David Tilles, Department of Public Health, presented a Consent Order in this matter. Respondent was present with Attorney Karen Noble.

Dr. Wolf made a motion, seconded by Dr. Rissi, to adopt the Consent Order as written. The motion passed with all in favor except Ms. Jacklin and Mr. McAnaney who were opposed and Dr. Green who abstained. Ms. Emmett signed the Order which imposes a reprimand, a \$10,000.00 civil penalty and a period of probation with conditions.

C. Naeem Sarfraz, MD - Petition No. 2016-1394

Staff Attorney David Tilles, Department of Public Health, presented a Consent Order in this matter. Respondent was present with Attorney Michael Neubert.

Dr. Wolf made a motion, seconded by Dr. Green, to adopt the Consent Order as written. The motion passed with all in favor except Ms. Jacklin and Dr. Sauer who were opposed, Dr. Patel and Dr. Yuan who abstained and Dr. Rissi who was recused. Ms. Emmett signed the Order which imposes a reprimand, a \$7500.00 civil penalty and probation for a period of eighteen months
