CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, National Vision, Inc. d/b/a/ Vision Center #2282 of East Windsor, Connecticut (hereinafter "respondent") has been issued optical selling permit number 001551 by the Department of Public Health (hereinafter "the Department") pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes, Chapter 381, as amended.

WHEREAS, respondent admits:

- On or about November 1, 2013 respondent changed its business location from 69 Prospect Hill Road, East Windsor, Connecticut ("69 Prospect Hill Road") to 44 Prospect Hills Road, East Windsor, Connecticut ("44 Prospect Hill Road").
- 2. From approximately November 1, 2013 through March 2019 respondent operated with an invalid optical permit when said permit named 69 Prospect Hill Road as the one and only address therein instead of the correct address, 44 Prospect Hill Road.
- The above described facts constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §20-154 and/or Connecticut State Agencies Regulations for Opticians including, without limitation, §§20-141-11, 20-141-12 and/or 20-141-20.

WHEREAS, respondent, in consideration of this Consent Order, has chosen not to contest this matter and agrees that for purposes of this or any future proceedings before the Connecticut Board of Examiners for Opticians (hereinafter "the Board"), this Consent Order shall have the same effect as if proven and ordered after a full hearing held pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §§19a-10, 19a-14 and 20-154.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §§19a-14, 19a-17 and 20-154, respondent hereby stipulates and agrees to the following:

- 1. Respondent waives its right to a hearing on the merits of this matter.
- 2. Respondent shall pay a three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) by certified or cashier's check payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut." The check shall reference the Petition Number on the face of the check, and shall be payable at the time respondent submits the executed Consent Order to the Department.
- 3. Respondent shall comply with all state and federal statutes and regulations.
- 4. Respondent shall pay all costs necessary to comply with this Consent Order.
- This Consent Order is effective on the first day of the month immediately following the date this Consent Order is accepted and ordered by the Board.
- 6. Respondent understands this Consent Order is a public document and evidence of the above admitted violations shall be deemed true in any proceeding before the Board in which its compliance with this Consent Order or with Connecticut General Statutes §§20-150 and/or 20-154 and/or Connecticut State Agencies Regulations for Opticians including, without limitation, §§20-141-11, 20-141-12, 20-141-18 and/or 20-141-20. Further, respondent understands that any discipline imposed by this Consent Order shall be reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank.
- 7. This Consent Order and terms set forth herein are not subject to reconsideration, collateral attack or judicial review under any form or in any forum and respondent waives any right to seek reconsideration or modification of this Consent Order pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §4-181a. Respondent agrees that this Consent Order shall not be subject to modification as a result of any claim that the terms contained herein may result in action by third parties, including, but not limited to, healthcare facilities and/or credentialing or licensure boards. Respondent assumes all responsibility for assessing such actions prior to the execution of this document. Further, this Order is not subject to appeal or review under the

provisions of Connecticut General Statutes, Chapters 54 or 368a, provided that this stipulation shall not deprive respondent of any rights that she may have under the laws of the State of Connecticut or of the United States.

- 8. This Consent Order is a revocable offer of settlement which may be modified by mutual agreement or withdrawn by the Department at any time prior to its being executed by the last signatory.
- 9. Respondent permits a representative of the Department's Healthcare Quality and Safety Branch to present this Consent Order and the factual basis for this Consent Order to the Board. Respondent understands that the Board has complete and final discretion as to whether this executed Consent Order is approved or accepted. Respondent hereby waives any claim of error that could be raised that is related to or arises during the course of the Board's discussions regarding whether to approve or reject this Consent Order and/or a Board member's participation during this process, through the Board member's review or comments, including but not limited to bias or reliance on evidence outside the administrative record if this matter proceeds to a hearing on a statement of charges resulting in a proposed decision by the Board and/or a panel of the Board and a final decision by the Board.
- 10. Respondent consulted with its attorney prior to signing this document.
- 11. The execution of this document has no bearing on any criminal liability without the written consent of the Director of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit or the State's Attorney's Office where the allegation occurred or Bureau Chief of the applicable unit in the Chief State's Attorney's Office. The purpose of this Consent Order is to resolve the pending administrative license disciplinary petition only, and is not intended to affect any civil or criminal liability or defense.
- 12. This Consent Order embodies the entire agreement of the parties with respect to this case. All previous communications or agreements regarding the subject matter of this consent order, whether oral or written, between the parties are superseded unless expressly incorporated herein or made a part hereof.
