Review Progress and Successes from 2016 Action Teams survey		 Survey results indicated that a baseline was established for most strategies, there was discussion about setting realistic goals and boiling down the plan, good strategizing and convening a diverse group, group worked well together and made appropriate progress. Strengths included organized tracking of goals and processes, collaborative approach by team members, skilled facilitators, strength of participants at the table. 	
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Discuss challenges, gaps, lessons learned from survey	 Discussion and survey results included getting buy in of the plan across all focus areas, SIM seems to take over the focus of the group, lack of taking into account a shifting health care delivery landscape, unrealistic expectation or ambiguity about the extent that participants in the committees bear responsibility for the results, figuring out which individuals and organizations will take ownership over making sure goals are met since DPH resources are limited, lack of resources to champion and fund initiatives. Lessons learned from the survey were to include more active sectors that may be advancing strategies in the plan, involve more community groups, better data and coordination with governmental divisions, refine goals and objectives which are currently multifaceted and hard to define, how best to work together and that the answer may be different than what we initially thought.
Key Environmental Factors to Consider	 A variety of health care reform initiatives are going on at state level such as SIM and Medicaid reform. Action teams need to be aware of the information to inform discussion on Sept. 8. The survey results also indicated that funding/budget cuts and legislative interest and having access to good information will impact this work.
