Timeline & Future SHIP Direction		<p><u>2017 Policy Agenda Update</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This action team had proposed seeking policy related to seatbelts for all positions in motor vehicles and a motorcycle helmet law for drivers and passengers. Our partners at the CT Department of Transportation included these topics in their proposed Transportation Bill; unfortunately, both of these items were removed before the bill was passed out of committee. • One success from this year’s SHIP Policy Agenda was the Community Health Worker bill, (SB 126; Public Act 17-74) which passed and was signed by the governor on 6/30/17. This bill specifically defines the role of CHWs. • A finalized state budget is not expected until early fall. • <i>Questions for the team to think about:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ How can the team play a larger role in advocacy and education? ○ How can the team make people care more about the issues? ○ How can the team tailor its messages? <p><u>HCT 2020 Implementation Timeline</u></p> <p><i>Next 3-6 months</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Action teams will identify strategies for their 2018 Action Agendas 	

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The next Advisory Council meeting is on September 26, 2017. • October to December 2017: We hope to schedule a coalition conference call to share progress with members. • CPHA Conference: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ There will be a “SHIP 101” presentation at the October conference; and action teams will provide Year 2 progress report to be included in the Interim evaluation for the SHIP. ○ There will be two presentations on suicide prevention. The first is an oral presentation titled: ‘Identifying and Supporting High Risk Communities to Prevent Youth Suicide’. The second is a panel discussion titled: ‘Zero Suicide Approach Implementation in Diverse Health and Behavioral Health Care Settings with At Risk Populations’. <p><i>Next 6-12 months</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The HCT 2020 Interim Progress Report will be out in January 2018. • The State Health Assessment (SHA) will be updated in 2018. • The Healthy CT2020 State Health Improvement Plan (SHIP) will be updated in 2019.

The DPH Injury program will follow-up with this. <p><u>Motor Vehicle Crashes</u> <i># of deaths from motor vehicle crashes in Connecticut</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Baseline (2010): 218 deaths • Current (2013): 279 deaths

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Question: Are the strategies effective? Is there a stronger evidence-based approach?</i> <p>Fall Prevention:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The fall prevention survey distribution to the CT Conference of Municipalities (CCM) was delayed until the close of the current legislative session. <p>Suicide Prevention:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <u>Strategy change:</u> A justification has been drafted on why the targets in the action agenda should be changed. Action team Co-Leads need to follow up with the SHIP Advisory Council regarding the request to make changes in the suicide prevention strategies to better align with the CT Suicide Prevention Plan. - It was suggested that the team look into getting on the agenda for one of the monthly local health webinars. - A map of CT titled, 'Color Me Blue-Mapping Teen Suicide to Help Prevent Them' was shared with the team. The map indicates the regions in CT where suicide is high and regions where it is low. It is available on UCONN today. - DMHAS is going to do a statewide needs assessment that targets key stakeholders across the state.
