9:00	Review Work to Date	15 mins	 Amanda Durante opened meeting at 9:00. Carol Bower took roll call. (See end of notes for participants.) Amanda reviewed output from first meeting and work done creating an overall goal for Injury and Violence Prevention. Goal modified to read: "Create an environment in which exposure to injuries is minimized or eliminated." (State further in document that injury is inclusive of unintentional injury, intentional self-injury, and intentional injury to others.)

9:15 – 10:00	Discuss Approach to Crafting Objectives	45 mins	 Amanda reviewed draft objectives from HP2020, sent to in advance to group members, and asked for preferred approach to crafting objectives prior to 6/20/13 meeting. Pina Violano suggested a focus on areas where there are data and that present issues for state, including Child Maltreatment, Motor Vehicles, Homicide, Suicide, Traumatic Brain Injury, Falls, and Poisoning; also, any areas where group members have expertise. It was clarified that the role of the work groups is to develop a goal, objectives, and strategies for Healthy Connecticut 2020, and recommendations for the first phase (1-3 years) of implementation. The "front end" Plan should be inclusive of all injury and violence "areas of concentration" for which trackable data exist, whereas the 1-3 year implementation priorities will be narrower and more focused. [Post-conference-call note: This structure was requested by the DPH Commissioner.] Amanda suggested using HP2020 measurable objectives (morbidity and mortality) as starting points. Pina discussed the value of a life-course approach to developing strategies Amanda asked that each person on the call volunteer for a specific injury topic area and work prior to 6/20/13 on pulling together data, identifying potential objectives, and outlining potential strategies (both existing initiatives and potential additional, evidence based strategies). Amanda also asked that members identify subject matter experts who would be helpful to consult on drafts and/or participate in the 6/20/13 meeting. Deb Shulansky suggested that work group members add educational information, flyers, etc. developed by their organizations to the DROPBOX, for use and reference by other members in their work.
