12:15pm-1:00pm	Galactagogues	The subject of Galactagogues came up in recent monitoring observations and on the August peer counseling call. Due to this topic being relevant to some of our participants and various products in the marketplace advertised to boost "milk supply"  The group discussed what participants are using and what staff is providing as feedback. Several WIC IBCLC provided their recommendations re: use of galactagogues and the consensus was that when participants bring up this topic, it goes back to identifying if removing milk from the breast is occurring. As we all know, WIC staff are not prescribers and currently there is no FDA approved galactagogue available in the US. There are no WIC Federal regulations on galactagogues, but they are not allowable costs and cannot be purchased with WIC funds. Further, WIC staff cannot recommend or advise on this topic d/t scope of practice. As indicated in the ABM Clinical Protocol #9: Use of Galactogogues in Initiating or Augmenting Maternal Milk Production, Second Revision 2018 (bfmed.org), there are pharmaceutical galactagogues that require in the US off-label prescription from a medical provider as well as used under medical supervision and should involve an IBCLC to ensure that there is adequate milk removal. Various foods, herbs and beverages recommended and used throughout history, there is little scientific evidence of their	LG/ML and local IBCLC's

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		effectiveness and safety. It is important to not dismiss cultural or familial traditions and value related to use of foods, drinks and herbs and WIC staff should ensure they are properly documenting conversations and referring participants back to the health care team and IBCLC regarding these practices. The most important conversation that WIC staff can have when a mom reports concern of low milk supply, is to ask open ended questions about milk removal and the mom's reasoning for thinking her supply is low. It may also be good to review the infant's growth as a reinforcement of supply. However, in cases where an infant isn't gaining well, a review of milk removal, method of feeding i.e., at breast or expressed and referral to the WIC IBCLC, DBE or community lactation support as well as the pediatrician is warranted.  Based on the increased availability of products that claim to enhance milk on the market, we plan to develop a content sheet on this topic to assist WIC staff in having these important conversations.
