RE:	CRI Budget Review and Guidance	

All submitted annual budgets for Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) funding are currently being reviewed. Do <u>not</u> begin work with consultant(s) until the Department provides official budget approval. The Department has asked that the CRI leads engage in agreements with consultants directly, to support the regional planning work, as outlined in the contractual terms. Subcontractor budgets that reflect a consultant(s) working at the local level, not the regional level, will likely be rejected. Please revisit regional PHEP BP4 budgets and convene meetings, as needed, to ensure that the budgets reflect the regional work outlined in the contract.

Justifications for all expenses are required. Salary and Wage justifications shall reflect specific activities and outputs that will be completed with the funding and should directly align with the contract deliverables.

Upon receipt of departmental budget approval and execution of contracts or amendments, copies of all subcontractor agreements, or updated annexes, shall be submitted to <u>DPH.PHEP@ct.gov</u> for inclusion in regional fiduciary files.
