The Safety Net Program helps families when their Temporary Family Assistance (TFA) ends.

This help is in the community and each family will have a case manager.

The family will make a plan with the case manager and take steps to reach the goals of the plan.

If families are actively engaged with their case manager and are adhering to the agreed upon plan, then Safety Net Services may provide help with:

- finding and keeping a job
- meeting job goals
- finding housing
- finding child care
- finding transportation
- learning new skills
- getting community-based services
- paying for rent, food or utilities (pending available funding and compliance with the case management plan)

ARE SAFETY NET SERVICES FOR ME?

Safety Net Services are for you, if:

- ✓ *you have at least one child under the age of 18 living with you, or under 19 and still a fulltime student in secondary school,*
- ✓ *have exhausted TFA time limits,*
- ✓ *have little or no income,*
- ✓ *want help meeting your goals, and*
- ✓ *need extra support*
