VOCA CASE MANAGEMENT

Provides holistic supportive services for victims of crime to promote safety and resiliency. VOCA Case Managers support the personal growth and emotional healing of victims through:

- Assistance with Victims Compensation Process
- Advocacy and Emotional Support
- Connection to resources like counseling, housing assistance, child care, and transportation
- Crisis intervention and safety planning
