


# PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

On 2020, the Department of Social Services (the "Department") issued a *Notice of Action* to (the "Appellant") terminating her household's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program ("SNAP") benefits effective 2020.

On 2020, the Appellant filed an online request for an administrative hearing with the Office of Legal Counsel, Regulations, and Administrative Hearings ("OLCRAH").

On 2020, the OLCRAH scheduled the administrative hearing for 2020.

On 2020, in accordance with sections 17b-60, 17b-61 and 4-176e to 4-189, inclusive, of the Connecticut General Statutes, the OLCRAH held an administrative hearing. The following individuals participated in the proceeding:

# STATEMENT OF ISSUE

The issue is whether the Department terminated the Appellant's SNAP benefits effective , 2020 in error.

## FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Appellant's SNAP certification period was due for its annual renewal by 2020. (Exhibit 2)
- 2. In 2020, the Appellant moved to (Appellant Testimony)
- 3. On address of record to complete and return by 2020. (Exhibit 2)
- 4. On 2020, the Post Office returned the redetermination form as undelivered to the Appellant at her address of record. The Post Office provided the Department with the Appellant's forwarding address for U.S. mail: (Department Representative Testimony) (Exhibit 2)
- 5. The Appellant uses her mother's address of to receive mail. (Appellant Testimony)
- On the Department issued a new redetermination form for the Appellant to complete and return, mailing the form to (Exhibit 2)
- 7. On 2020, the Department issued a *Notice of Action* stating that the Appellant's SNAP benefits would end effective 2020 for failing to meet the program requirements. (Exhibit 1)
- 8. The Appellant received the Department's 2020 mailing. (Appellant Testimony)
- 9. On 2020, the Appellant moved to . (Appellant Testimony)
- 10. As of the date of this hearing, the Appellant had not completed the redetermination form and returned it to the Department. (Appellant Testimony)
- 11. Title 7, Code of Federal Regulations ("C.F.R.") 273.15 (c)(1) provides in part that "[w]ithin 60 days of receipt of a request for a fair hearing, the State agency shall assure that the hearing is conducted, a decision is reached, and the household and local agency are notified of the decision...." On the second state agency are control of the decision....." On the second state agency are been due by the OLCRAH received the Appellant's hearing request. The issuance would have been due by 2020. This decision is timely.

# CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

 The Department of Social Services is the designated state agency for the administration of the supplemental nutrition assistance program pursuant to the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008. Conn. Gen. Stat. § 17b-2. 2. Title 7, Code of Federal Regulations 273.14 addresses SNAP recertification. Subsection (a) of this section notes,

No household may participate beyond the expiration of the certification period assigned in accordance with §273.10 (f) without a determination of eligibility for a new period. The State agency must establish procedures for notifying households of expiration dates, providing application forms, scheduling interviews, and recertifying eligible households prior to the expiration of certification periods. Households must apply for recertification and comply with interview and verification requirements. 7 C.F.R. § 273.14 (a).

The Appellant failed to complete the SNAP renewal process by the final day of her certification period, as the Appellant did not submit a completed redetermination form to the Department by 2020.

The Department correctly terminated the Appellant's SNAP benefits effective 2020, the final day of her certification period.

### DECISION

The Appellant's appeal is DENIED.

### **RIGHT TO REQUEST RECONSIDERATION**

The Appellant has the right to file a written reconsideration request within 15 days of the mailing date of the decision on the grounds there was an error of fact or law, new evidence has been discovered or other good cause exists. If the request for reconsideration is granted, the Appellant will be notified within 25 days of the request date. No response within 25 days means that the request for reconsideration has been denied. The right to request a reconsideration is based on § 4-181a (a) of the Connecticut General Statutes.

Reconsideration requests should include <u>specific</u> grounds for the request: for example, indicate <u>what</u> error of fact or law, <u>what</u> new evidence, or <u>what</u> other good cause exists.

#### **RIGHT TO APPEAL**

The Appellant has the right to appeal this decision to Superior Court within 45 days of the mailing of this decision, or 45 days after the agency denies a petition for reconsideration of this decision, provided that the petition for reconsideration was filed timely with the Department. The right to appeal is based on § 4-183 of the Connecticut General Statutes. To appeal, a petition must be filed at Superior Court. A copy of the petition must be served upon the Office of the Attorney General, 55 Elm Street, Hartford, CT 06106 or the Commissioner of the Department of Social Services, 55 Farmington Avenue, Hartford, CT 06105. A copy of the petition must also be served on all parties to the hearing.

The 45-day appeal period may be extended in certain instances if there is good cause. The extension request must be filed with the Commissioner of the Department of Social Services in writing no later than 90 days from the mailing of the decision. Good cause circumstances are evaluated by the Commissioner or his designee in accordance with § 17b-61 of the Connecticut General Statutes. The Agency's decision to grant an extension is final and is not subject to review or appeal.

The appeal should be filed with the clerk of the Superior Court in the Judicial District of New Britain or the Judicial District in which the Appellant resides.
