<b>Connecticut Alliance To Benefit Law Enforcement (CABLE)</b>	<p>Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) trainings are conducted for law enforcement officers, other public safety personnel within Connecticut, and members of the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services Mobile Crisis Teams only. The CIT Basic Academy will prepare participants to: (1) recognize and respond to various behavioral health conditions including trauma, (2) understand special communication, and de-escalation practices to defuse potentially volatile situations, and (3) develop strategies for partnering with mental health mobile crisis teams who can follow up on calls to ensure that the person is offered services. These partnerships are critical to reducing the number of law enforcement calls for service and recurring emergency room visits. <b>State of Connecticut Dept. of Motor Vehicles- The Blue Envelope</b>	Effective January 1, 2020, The "Blue Envelope" was created by a new state law to enhance communication between a police officer and a driver with autism.  The purpose of the envelope is to have the driver place their insurance card, registration and driver license in it so it can be handed to the officer during a stop.  The outside of the envelope provides helpful tips and instructions for both the officer and driver on how to successfully communication with each other.
