If you have a disability, receive income from the Social Security Administration and are interested in returning to work, speak to someone from the Social Security Administration about Plan to Achieve Self-Support or PASS. This program is an SSI provision which allows individuals to return to work and set aside income to accomplish work goals. PASS can allow individuals to set aside money for supplies to start a business, school expenses, equipment and tools, transportation, uniforms and other items or services you need to reach your employment goal.
