

CEAP FAQ: What is the typical CEAP benefit?

Answer the questions below to find out the **amount of winter heating assistance benefits** your household may qualify for.

Q: How do you pay for heat?

A: Payment to utility company

A: Payment to landlord (i.e. heat is included in my rent)

Q: Do you live with anyone who is elderly (age 60 or older), under age 6, or who has a disability?

A: Yes

You can receive up to **\$530** in basic CEAP benefits this winter, depending on your household's income and size. Your minimum benefit is **\$230**

A: No

You can receive up to **\$480** in basic CEAP benefits this winter, depending on your household's income and size. Your minimum benefit is **\$180**

A: Yes

You can receive up to **\$125** in basic CEAP benefits this winter, depending on your household's income and size. Your minimum benefit is **\$75**

The above describes your basic CEAP benefits. If you heat with deliverable fuel (e.g., oil or propane), read about additional benefits below.
