# 9-1-1 Curriculum for Pre-K - Grade 1

### Concept - 9-1-1 is a special number

- What makes 9-1-1 different than other numbers?
- 9-1-1 gets you help fast
- Calling 9-1-1 will cause a police, fire or medical person to go to your home.
- What is the difference between your home number and 9-1-1

Demonstration and Teaching Aids

- What does the number 9 look like? The number 1?
- Recognizing the numbers 9-1-1 on the phone.
- Dial 9, dial 1, and dial 1 again (difference between nine-one-one and nine-eleven. There is no eleven on the phone)
- Demonstrate on various types of phones i.e.: cordless, cell, rotary dial, 9-1-1 simulator
- Police, fire and medical response
  - Share equipment and uniforms.
  - Have police, fire and/or medical staff participate in class
  - Use pictures of police, fire and medical staff

Songs and rhymes are appropriate for this level and help children memorize the number. Utilize different terms and explain vocabulary often used.

### <u>Concept</u> - When do you need to use 9-1-1? Distinguishing between emergencies and nonemergencies.

When do you need to call?

- "When you need help fast."
- Mommy is sick.
- There is a fire.
- There is a stranger in my house and no adult is home.
- If you are home alone or left in the car alone.

Explain that child won't get "in trouble" for calling. Even if it is a mistake, stay on the line.

#### Demonstration and Teaching Aids

Use flip charts and flash cards to do comparisons on what requires 9-1-1 and what doesn't.

#### **Concept** - **Providing information to 9-1-1**

- What is my address?
- What is my phone number?
- Telling 9-1-1 what is happening.
- Answering the telecommunicator's questions.
- Speaking clearly on the phone.
- Explain that it is normal to feel scared when calling.
